Virtue of the Month - Truthfulness

Q: What is truth?

A: Truth is the way things really are as revealed by God outside of our opinions or feelings. Truth is fully revealed in Christ and in the Scriptures. All Truth is God's truth.

Jesus answered, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." *John 14:6*

Q: How can we know the truth?

A: Jesus prayed, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your Word is truth." *John 17:17*

Q: Why must we love the truth?

A: We must love the truth because God is truth and God loves truth. To love God is to love truth.

[Jesus] said ..., "If you continue in My word, you are truly My disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." *John 8:31-32*

Virtue of the Month - Goodness

Q: What is goodness, and where does it come from?

A: Goodness is the perfect character of God. All that He does is good, and He teaches us what is good through His Word.

“You are good, and do good; teach me your statutes.” *Psalms 119:68*

Q: Why should we love what is good?

A: We should love what is good because it pleases God and shapes our hearts to be more like Christ.

“Learn to do good; seek justice, rebuke the oppressor; defend the fatherless; plead for the widow.” *Isaiah 1:17*

Q: How should we live if we want to do what is good?

A: We should do what is right, serve others with kindness, and seek to bless others for God’s glory.

“And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.” *Galatians 6:9*



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December - Beauty Virtue of the Month - Gentleness

Q: What is beauty, and where do we find it?

A: Beauty is the glory and goodness of God made visible. We see true beauty in God's creation, His truth, and especially in Jesus. There is no beauty apart from God.

"Rather let your [adornment] be the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God." *1 Peter 3:4*

Q: Why should we love what is beautiful?

A: We should love what is beautiful because it stirs our hearts to worship God and delight in His goodness.

"Oh, worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness! Tremble before Him, all the earth." Psalm 96:9

Q: How can we show beauty in how we live?

A: We show beauty by creating good and lovely things, honoring God in our words and actions, and reflecting His glory in all we do.

"And let the beauty of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands for us; yes, establish the work of our hands." Psalm 90:17



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January - Love Virtue of the Month - Compassion

Q: What is love, and where does it come from?

A: Love is from God, because God is love. We know what love is by looking at how God loves us, especially through Jesus.

“We love Him because He first loved us.” *1 John 4:19*

Q: Why should we love God and others?

A: We should love because God has ordered what is most important – to love Him and love others.

“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.” *Luke 10:27*

Q: How can we show love in how we live?

A: We show love by being kind, forgiving others, serving joyfully, and putting others before ourselves, just like Jesus did.

“Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.” *Ephesians 4:32*



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February - Justice Virtue of the Month - Mercy

Q: What is justice, and where does it come from?

A: Justice means doing what is right and fair according to God's law. True justice comes from God's perfect character.

"He has shown you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justly, love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." *Micah 6:8*

Q: Why should we care about justice?

A: We should care about justice because God loves justice, and loving what He loves helps shape our hearts to be like His.

"For the Lord loves justice, and does not forsake His saints; they are preserved forever, but the descendants of the wicked shall be cut off." *Psalms 37:28*

Q: How should we act if we want to do what is just?

A: We should treat others with fairness, speak the truth, stand up for what is right, and defend those who are weak.

"You shall follow what is altogether just, that you may live and inherit the land which the Lord your God is giving you." *Deuteronomy 16:20*



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March - Friendship Virtue of the Month - Faithfulness

Q: What is friendship, and where does it come from?

A: Friendship is a gift from God. True friendship is built on trust and reflects the kind of friendship Jesus offers us.

“This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.”

John 15:12

Q: Why should we love and value good friends?

A: We should value friendship because God made us to live in community, encourage one another, and reflect Him through our relationships.

“Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, for he has no one to help him up.” *Ecclesiastes 4:9-10*

Q: How should we treat our friends?

A: We should be kind, faithful, honest, and forgiving. We should put others before ourselves and treat them as Jesus treats us.

“And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works.”

Hebrews 10:24



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April

Virtue of the Month - Peace

Q: What is worry, and what does God say about it?

A: Worry is when we are afraid or anxious about things we cannot control. God tells us not to worry, but to trust Him.

“Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.” *Philippians 4:6-7*

Q: Why should we trust God when we feel worried?

A: We can trust God because He is loving and He is strong. All God does is good.

“Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous hand.” *Isaiah 41:10*

“Whenever I am afraid, I will trust in You.” *Psalms 56:3*
